Abstract

This study aims to determine the legal protection of Indonesian female workers who work in Malaysia. In addition, this study also aims to explain the process of sending Indonesian migrant workers who have not left for work to Malaysia to the process of returning Indonesian migrant workers who work in Malaysia. In the process of working, it is not denied that Indonesian migrant workers experience conflicts or unpleasant actions from their employers, the actions that the government is taking to resolve these cases will also be discussed in this study.

This research is a normative legal research, which is supported by data from direct interviews with figures who have the duty to protect migrant workers who work outside Indonesia, especially Singapore and Malaysia. After conducting interviews with leaders and foundations who worked in tackling the problems of Indonesian migrant workers, the research data was obtained from the law, data from the internet to books that reviewed the research topics that the authors did.

Based on this research, it was obtained information that the Indonesian government should take more serious and concrete actions to protect Indonesian migrant workers in the pre-departure process, post-employment or contract period until repatriation. It is intended that Indonesian migrant workers obtain legal protection that they should receive as one of the heroes of the Indonesian foreign exchange.
